Draft permit conditions

Note: Excavation plans are to be cited in the text of the permit

Excavation Permit

The site plan review permit is incorporated as a part of this permit.

The owner/operator shall provide a reclamation bond for the amount of \$75,000, adequate to cover cost of reclamation and re-vegetation of two phases and reclamation of access roads and staging or support areas.

Reclamation and re-vegetation of all areas in a completed phase, except for access roads and temporary structures as indicated in the plans, must be completed by the end of the growing season of the year following cessation of excavation activities in that phase.

The owner/operator shall notify the planning board if excavation of a phase is completed and the previous phase has not been reclaimed and re-vegetated. The owner/operator must provide the reason why reclamation and re-vegetation for two phases has occurred, (such as initiation and completion during the non-growing season). The owner/operator must obtain approval from the planning board to begin operation in the next planned phase. Reclamation and re-vegetation of completed phases shall be performed at the earliest reasonable time.

Site Plan Review

Importation of asphalt or other non-earthen bulk material from other towns for use as an adjunct to crushed or processed material is prohibited, except that processed material intended for sale or re-distribution is allowed provided that the material is not further processed on site. Earthen material is defined as soil, sand, gravel and stone.

Permanent or temporary storage of asphalt or other non-earthen bulk materials is prohibited, except that processed material is allowed if intended for display, sale or re-distribution and provided that the material is not further processed on site.

The existing asphalt pile will be removed by December 31, 2009 and the site re-vegetated by the following spring.

The owner shall provide evidence that contamination of groundwater resources by leachates from the existing asphalt pile has not occurred.

Erosion control and stormwater management practices shall conform to practices detailed in the Excavation Plans

Degradation of water quality or stream habitat by increased siltation or alteration of water chemistry in Dyer Brook is prohibited. The owner/operator shall immediately notify the planning board of any activity (such as breach or failure of siltation fences, spills, etc.) that could result in degradation of water quality or stream habitat to Dyer Brook and is responsible for any remediation.

Site operations shall comply with details presented in the “addendum to Bootjack Road, LLC Site Plan Review Application”.

(This covers noise, street access, hours of operation. The level of detail is rather scant however, especially regarding dust control and calcium use on Bootjack: ie when to employ)

Crushing operation is limited to 30 days in the spring and 30 days in the fall. The owner/operator shall notify the chairman of the planning board of the day that crushing operation begins. Crushing operations are allowed 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Crushing operations may occur from April 1 to June 10 and from the date following the observed Labor Day Holiday to November 5. All reasonable efforts to minimize noise and dust must be employed.
