

TOWN OF HILL  
SELECTMENS MEETING  
APRIL 29, 2008

Present: Mike Brady, Mark Dow, John Lynch, Linda Henry (Assistant)

ROAD AGENT: Discussion took place again regarding purchasing the used loader as several options have fallen through. A personnel issue was brought up concerning sick and personal time. Dean received permission to provide Glenn Bartis with steel toed boots since he is working for the highway dept mowing, etc. Dean expressed concern about dealing with the Wythe's on Bunker Hill Road. He said that they have been confrontational with him and his crew causing problems getting their work done. John said to contact him the next time he works up there and he will deal with it. He also expressed concern about falling rocks under the Borough Road Bridge and asked to have a sign installed alerting people. Unsure of the liability issue, the Selectmen opted to hold off on that. He received permission to have the 1990 International truck sand blasted and painted for \$700.

MISC: Selectmen voted to have the compactor repaired at the Transfer Station. There is a meeting planned for the road study committee members to look at the roads to decide what needs to be repaired first. Gary David was in attendance for a brief period of time in which this was discussed. An intent to cut was signed for Carolyn Rivas (R1-30). Yield tax warrants were also signed. Briefly discussed amending fees for tires, but decided not to increase the fee at this time. Also discussed amending building permit fees and working on updating the personnel policies.

LAURA LYNCH: A local Real Estate agent asked about the possibility of building on non-conforming lots on Cass Mill Road, lots R3-37 and R3-37-1. She was told that the one lot would not be buildable since there is no building on it now and it does not have the minimum 3 acres required by zoning. She would have to apply for a variance from the Zoning Board.

WATER DEPT: Gerry Desrochers came in to have the Board sign some papers for the loan they are receiving from the USDA for improvements to the water system.

KEITH KELLOGG: Keith asked to have the penalties assessed to his property taxes abated due to issues with the Tax Collector not being open when he came in to pay the taxes. He said that he tried several times, but the office was closed. Selectmen unanimously agreed to abate the total penalty & fees in the amount of \$25.72.
