

TOWN OF HILL
SELECTMENS MEETING
OCTOBER 7, 2008

Present: Mike Brady, Mark Dow, John Lynch, Linda Henry (Assistant)

MISC: Brian VanDemark came in to see about painting the town office building. It is apparently too late in the year to do this. John said he met with Bristol again about the ambulance contract, but there is nothing new to report as they are still waiting for some issues to be resolved with another town. Selectmen signed the "Check Connect" agreement with Franklin Savings Bank for 2009. A building permit was approved for Paul Young, Bunker Hill Rd. (R12-50-2) to build a new home. Discussed the fuel consortium that the town participates in. The price that was agreed to is quite high this year and we will look into the possibility of getting out of it. Selectmen agreed with the schedule of fees for the transfer station. It will be posted on the town web-site.

ROAD AGENT: Dean submitted a revised proposal for the new garage doors for the town shed. Selectmen agreed to the changes. He reported that he was installing posts for the handicap signs at the town office, but it is too late to paint the lines. Discussed where to get sand this year. Dean reported that the test pits that were dug on Dearborn Rd. did not yield anything worthwhile for the towns use. He also reported on the Borough Rd. widening project and asked for the Boards input. He does not have much to guide him as far as boundaries are concerned, but he is trying to stay within the easement. John will go up tomorrow afternoon. He would like some of the expenses associated with the project to come from the Block Grant money, which the Board agreed to. John said that we may be able to save some money by having someone inspect the town vehicles as a fleet rather than individually. He will look into it. Dean also reported that Steve Punderson did some road repair on the Class VI portion of Clough Rd. which the Board had some concerns about a while ago. A lengthy discussion took place in regards to driveway permits.

CHERYL JOYCE: Cheryl inquired about installing a sign for the school. She said the high school shop would be constructing it and it would be fashioned after the town office sign. Selectmen agreed it would be ok to install it in the same place as the previous one, but a building permit application would still need to be completed to follow the zoning regulations because of its size.

NON PUBLIC SESSION: Entered into nps at 8:30PM to discuss a personnel matter. Also reviewed Police Chief applications. Two candidates were chosen for interviews. Nps ended at 8:50PM.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50PM.
