

TOWN OF HILL
SELECTMENS MEETING
SEPTEMBER 2, 2008

Present: Mike Brady, Mark Dow, John Lynch, Linda Henry (Assistant)

JAMES BLACKKEY: Mr. Blackey made another inquiry to have his property looked at. He would like it to reflect that it is no longer a mobile home. Since it would cost the town additional money to have the assessor look at it again, it was decided that Mark would inspect it.

BUILDING WORK: Raymond Judd and Joe Sanville came in to take a look at the work that needs to be done in the back of the town office building per the Boards request for bids on the project. Raymond also inquired about the Johnson lawsuit that is currently pending.

MISC: John reported that there is some confusion concerning the ambulance contract for 2009 after attending a meeting with Bristol and other area towns about the matter. John also said that he looked at the situation that was brought to their attention last week concerning rocks placed on Ned Gordon's lot on Borough Road. They are too large to move and he is not sure exactly how far they extend onto his property. John stated that he will hold off on calling a meeting of the Road Study Committee members until Dean provides some figures for road repairs. Selectmen decided they would continue with the search for garage doors for the town shed. Briefly discussed the Johnson lawsuit. Approved an application to move a mobile home out of the trailer park. Approved intent to cuts for the State (Wade State Forest) and John Christopher, 237 Borough Rd. (R1-36).

TOWN PROPERTY: Mike reported that he spoke to the town attorney about selling the lot on Borough Road (R3-9-9). He recommended not putting it out for bids or auction, but rather trying to work out a deal with the abutters. He also confirmed that the town keeps all the proceeds from the sale providing it has been at least 3 years since deeding to the town.

POLICE CHIEF: The Board received a letter of resignation from Chief of Police, Donald Sullivan. He will be done on September 9th. An ad will be put in two local papers to recruit for another chief with resumes to be received by October 7th. Mike will speak to Officer Dave Kratz to see if he would be willing to act as chief temporarily. Joe Mahoney and former police chief, Bob Dupuis, had a few suggestions about hiring a replacement for Donald. Bob also said that Franklin may be interested in contracting out services. Discussed replacing the cruiser.

NON PUBLIC SESSION: Selectmen entered into nps at 7:55PM to review an assistance application. Nps ended at 8:15PM.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15PM.
