



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE AND YOUR DRINKING WATER



What Is Household Hazardous Waste? Hazardous wastes typically found in homes includes: • Gasoline • Antifreeze • Photographic Chemicals • Oil-Based Paints • Drain Cleaners • Pesticides • Furniture Strippers • Oven Cleaners • Disinfectants • Kerosene • Spot Removers • Used Motor Oil • Auto Batteries • Other Items

Why Should I be Concerned? People are often unaware of the potential dangers of carelessly storing and disposing of common household products. Some products can injure you, your family, or your pets; damage the environment; or contaminate drinking water supplies.

Are Some Places At Greater Risk Than Others? The area you live in is of particular concern because it has been identified as an area from which groundwater flows to a public drinking water supply. If you have a well on your property, you also need to think about protecting the groundwater that supplies *your* well.
